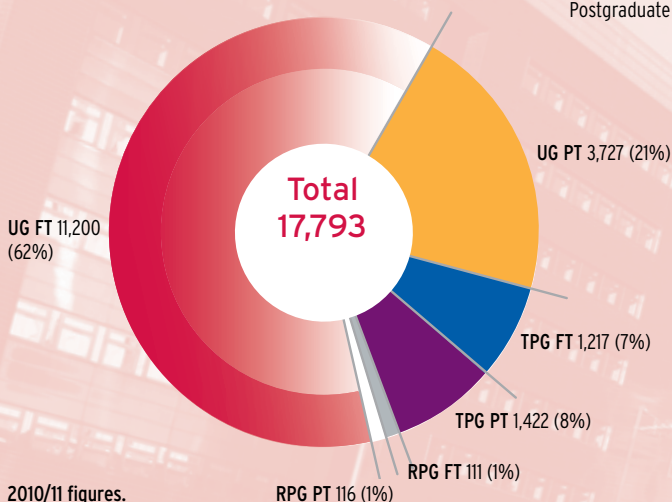
Vision

Graduate employability

At Edinburgh Napier we provide our students with industry informed courses which combine the optimum balance of theory and practice, so that our graduates can "hit the ground running" with their careers.

Edinburgh Napier is the only UK Higher Education Institution to offer a programme, titled *Confident Futures*, which develops employability skills sought by employers. Edinburgh Napier's Employer Mentoring Programme, part of the *Towards a Confident Future* project, was awarded Mentoring Project of the Year at the Scottish Mentoring Network conference 2011.

93.2% of our undergraduate students are in jobs or further study six months after graduating. (HESA 2009/10)

We are one of the UK's top five universities for Value Added, a measure of students' qualifications at entry against the honours degree results they go on to achieve. Guardian University Guide 2012.

Widening access

Edinburgh Napier has a long tradition of working with partners to build aspirations for higher education amongst those from low participation neighbourhoods and/or non-traditional backgrounds. Community engagement activities take place in schools, colleges and community settings. The development of 'articulation routes' in particular have helped to widen access to higher education.

Edinburgh, Lothians, Fife and Borders Regional Articulation Hub (ELRAH) is one of five Regional Articulation Hubs funded by the Scottish Funding Council and led by Edinburgh Napier to support articulation.

In 2010/11, 1,002 students joined Edinburgh Napier directly from a Scottish College.

Enhancement-led Institutional Review

The Quality Assurance Agency carried out an Enhancement-led Institutional Review (ELIR) of Edinburgh Napier in May 2011, reporting overarching confidence in our management of academic standards and the quality of the student learning experience.

Business Innovation Exchange

To further support the Institutes of Research and Innovation, Edinburgh Napier has led the establishment of a Business Innovation Exchange (BIE) to help make their expertise available to businesses.

BIE is a collaborative partnership with Queen Margaret and St Andrews universities that builds on the 2kt and 2kt+ knowledge transfer projects. Seven Business Development Executives, five based at Edinburgh Napier, and dedicated support staff will help Small to Medium-sized Enterprises tap in to universities' academic knowledge, facilities and intellectual property. BIE supports the Scottish Government's drive to increase innovation among SMEs and has received SEEKIT grant funding and a European Regional Development Fund grant.

Environmental expertise

Edinburgh Napier has been ranked the top university in Scotland for our environmental credentials by the People and Planet Green League 2011 for the second consecutive year.

We are committed to reducing our carbon footprint. This includes changes to the way we heat, light and use our buildings, investigating more sustainable methods of transport and reducing our water consumption and landfill waste.

We have been awarded the Carbon Trust Standard after achieving a 19% reduction in our carbon emissions between 01/08/06 - 31/07/09. The Standard is a mark of excellence and proves that we are committed to reducing our carbon footprint. Our five year carbon management plan takes us to 2013, where we aim to have reduced our carbon emissions by 25% from 2006/7 levels.

Estates

Edinburgh Napier has three main campuses at Craiglockhart, Merchiston and Sighthill. We also have smaller sites outside the city at Livingston and Melrose which are used by our nursing placement students.

As part of our £100m investment in our estates our Sighthill Campus opened in January 2011. Merchiston Campus will now also be refurbished and will bring our Faculty of Engineering, Computing & Creative Industries under one roof for the first time. The project will be completed by early 2013 and has already received a BREEAM rating of 'very good', the highest award for a refurbishment project.

A £30m extension and refurbishment of the University's Craiglockhart Campus was completed in 2004.
